

## **PERMISSION TO BROADCAST MUSICAL WORKS**

I/WE \_\_\_\_\_ (hereto known as "Owner") Authorize Emperor Multimedia Corporation Ltd. And it's NWR (Northern Warrior Radio), (hereto known as "Broadcaster") the unencumbered but non exclusive right to broadcast the following musical works by antenna, satellite, or Internet audio stream throughout the Universe without royalty payments. I/We also exempt Broadcaster from SOCAN Tariff-22 ("Tariff 22 - Communication of Musical Works via the Internet") legislation in Canada. This license is interpreted to be perpetual unless cancelled with 30 days notice in writing by either party.

This license is to be interpreted as a free promotional venture but not be interpreted as any form of business partnership, joint venture, or transfer of ownership.

Owner shall provide Broadcaster with an audio file in MP3, CD, Vinyl, Cassette, or any known or to be known format adequate to broadcast at 64Kps stereo minimum, in turn Broadcaster shall not accept any form of money payment from Owner for the rights to broadcast. It is at the sole discretion of Broadcaster as to when Owner's work is broadcasted and how often.

This License allows Broadcaster to also use Owner's work incorporated/merged into audio streams and broadcasts in whole or part. Such things include, but not limited to, show theme songs, sound effects, show promotional skits, etc. BUT NOT commercial advertising.

Owner acknowledges that it has the right to enter this agreement and that it is indeed the copyright owner, or authorized legal agent there-of. Neither party shall not allow any third party to administrate or circumvent this License while it is in force, including should Owner change record labels or management. Both parties are also responsible for notifying the other on change of contact information.

This License is interpreted to be signed and enforced in the Province of Ontario, Country of Canada and all litigation and interpretation to its execution shall commence there in a court of competent jurisdiction.

## INSTRUCTIONS:

Forward a signed copy of this document by mail and/or facsimile to the “Address of Broadcast Administrator” as listed on the License form. It is best if you print two copies of this and sign both and send one to us that way there is 2 original copies.

If you wish all works of yours to be covered under the license then you may list “All” or “all works by.....” (fill in your organization name) in the “Title of works” field.

It is **STRONGLY** recommended that after signing and delivering this License, you forward a copy to your management, label and/or any Copyright Collective you have Agreements with to be sure everyone is aware of your activities. This is not required but will reduce conflicts between the organizations in the future. **KEEP A COPY FOR YOURSELF!**

It is also not required but: you are free to seek legal council (a lawyer) on the interpretation on this document if you wish, it is recommended you do this **BEFORE** you sign it, however. The terms of this document are not negotiable.

Be also aware that this document is not considered “secret” or “private” unlike most of our Agreements and Contracts due to the nature of the activities it describes. The general public will not be permitted to see but government agencies and Copyright Collectives responsible to the administration and/or licensing of broadcasting may demand these documents for view. There will be a procedure and possibly a fee structure involved in that process but in general assume the information given here is public domain.

Why the need for this document? Because new laws are coming in around the world, most recently where we are, that will force stations like ours off the air or evoke heavy fees which we do not agree are fair. The way around it is to deal direct with the Copyright Owner (you), and to do that we are **REQUIRED** to have a document signed by the owner.
